SUNDAY SNOWDAY



Photos below are from the sledding event following the outdoor worship experience on Sunday, January 24. A fun time was had by all!




LET THE SUN SHINE AND LIGHT UP ST. JOHN'S!

The solar system is up and running at St. John's Lutheran Church, generating electricity and using less fossil fuel to power our church. Here's a dashboard view of the system generation. As you can see, the sunnier the day, the greater the savings. So you know what to pray for!



This next screenshot, from the dashboard, shows a picture of the solar array and some metrics, such as CO2 savings, weather forecast, current power generation, energy-balance on the morning of January 9, in the morning, and earnings.



The system went live in October, and is generating electricity and savings. The agreement we have thru Legacy Solar Co-op and our Solar Sponsor who funded the initial build of the system, along with grants from Focus on Energy and Solar for Good, takes the savings generated each quarter and pays the Solar Sponsor and, after the 6th year, we can purchase the system at the remaining, depreciated value. This mechanism is


the most cost-efficient way to finance the system with little upfront costs, and greatest savings over the life of the system, estimated at over \$100,000.

What we can use from YOU is your support with a modest annual commitment to giving \$200 each year for 6 years. At the end of that period, we will have enough to buy-out the remaining asset value of the system and the system will be 100% owned by St. John's and generate savings of about 26% up to the life-expectancy of the system, which is about 25 years. American National Red Cross Blood Drive

The need for blood is constant and only volunteer donors can fulfill that need for patients in our community. Nationwide, someone needs a unit of blood every 2-3 seconds and most of us will need blood in our lifetime. The next local blood drive is on Saturday, March 6, 7AM-11AM in the Friendship room at St. John's.

All donors and staff are expected to wear a mask, allow a temperature check and social distance. A blood donor card, driver's license, or two other forms of identification are required at check-in. Appointments are preferred; walk-ins will be accepted as room allows.

Dear Friends and Family,

We join you in hoping and praying that 2021 will be a year with less isolation and more unity in our home country. What we do know, is that God is sovereign, in control, and is at work accomplishing His purposes.

The Mexican government has been taking precautions based on reported cases and deaths. However, there is a lot of under-reporting. In Mitla, where we live, the main industry is tourism. The textile artisans have suffered greatly. Many quickly shifted to making colorful masks. Others have repurposed their shops to sell fresh fruits, meats and grains that were normally sold in the large indoor market.

Since our return to the U.S., we have learned that there are many different views on how to deal with the virus on this side of the border (masks vs. no masks vs. herd immunity). When in Mexico, we always wear masks on our Center, out for a walk, and especially when shopping. We abide by some rules that we do not agree with. However, we continually remind ourselves that we are citizens of heaven, first, and temporary sojourners on earth. As guests in Mexico, we would never want to do something that would jeopardize the Bible translation task. Like the apostle Paul stated, "Though I am free and belong to no one, I have made myself a slave to everyone, to win as many as possible..." I Corinthians 9:19-23

We now have plans to return to Mexico on February 4. Just as we were making this decision and given official permission by our organization to return, we heard that cases and deaths are on the rise in Mitla. One entire family died of COVID-19 and two more died a few days later. Our employees have been sent back home for the next week or longer, even though the government is allowing more interaction.

We sought counsel and decided to continue with our plans. Only a remnant remains and they are growing weary of "holding down the fort." We plan to stay only two months. During that time, we hope to alleviate the stress of those who have remained all of these long months since early last year. We also plan to move completely out of our home there, since we expect to spend less time in Mexico in future years.

Remote Assignments

In our last newsletter, we explained how we would spend our time on "home assignment." That time is coming to an end. However, while we are in Mexico, we will receive new "remote assignments" that we can do mostly from the U.S. side of the border. At our ages, we anticipate serving in administrative roles. We can actively participate via email, Zoom meetings and working interactively with others on shared computer files. As mentioned above, we also plan to return to Mexico for a few months every year to serve in more "hands-on" ways.

Our expenses for living in the U.S. will be significantly higher. Our new U.S. based ministry budget is \$738 more per month. So our first task upon return will be to build up our financial support team.

We Moved to Wisconsin!

You prayed. God answered. We were able to purchase a home in Montello, Wisconsin, on November 23. We love the south-central location in Wisconsin and the lakeside view next to downtown in this little tourist town. It was virtually move-in ready, we carry no mortgage, and we will be able to keep our living expenses to a minimum.

Wedding Plans

On May 2, Megan's Wedding Celebration will happen in Rockford, Illinois. We are looking forward to this outdoor event as we officially welcome Dipta Chadwick into our family!

We have a guest room that will be open for visitors next summer! We thank those of you who have sent in special gifts in recent months. It has really helped with our moving and setup costs. And we never take for granted about 60 regular supporters who faithfully send in contributions each month, quarter or year. You are the ones who put food on our table!




